## Motivations of a Vandal

#### Boredom

Some people just want to cause mischief or have fun. This is often the case with short, meaningless edits, like inserting nonsense words.

#### **Political**

Others aim to push a particular agenda. They might add biased information or delete dissenting viewpoints, manipulating the information to support their views.


### **Personal Vendetta**

Sometimes, people target specific individuals or organizations. They might insert false information or make offensive edits.

## **Attention Seeking**

Vandals might simply want to be noticed. They might add inappropriate humor to articles that are likely to be read by a larger audience.

# **Identifying Types of Vandalism**

## Blanking

Removing all the content from a page or section.

#### Deletion

Removing accurate information from a page.

#### Insertion

Adding irrelevant or nonsensical content to a page.

## Spam

Adding promotional content for a product or service.

Rollback allows editors to revert multiple edits in an instant.

2 Speed and Efficiency


Rollback is a quick and efficient way to handle simple vandalism.

# Reviewing and Revert Vandalism



#### **Review**

Before reverting an edit, carefully review it. Look for context, potential misunderstandings, or legitimate edits.



#### Revert

If it's clear vandalism, revert the edit by clicking the revert button.



#### Comment

Leave a brief explanation for your revert. This helps other editors understand why you reverted the edit.
